

Rescue Glide Ratchet Strap Application

Use: Move recumbent animal **Materials:**

- 4'x 8' Rescue glide
- 2 2"- 4" HD Ratchet straps
- Hobbles, rope, pulley, webbing
- 2" x 6' Velcro head strap
- Padding or towels
- Head protector or life jacket
- Blind fold

Personnel:

- 2+ riggers
- 1 animal handler controls head at all times
- Haul team or vehicle to pull glide

Procedure:

- Apply head protection and blindfold if appropriate.
- 2. Slide or roll animal onto glide.
- 3. Attach ratchet straps to sternal side cut outs and lay across barrel between legs.
- 4. Apply padding material under straps and attach ratchet hooks on dorsal side.
- 5. Crank ratchets until sides of glide elevate around animal. Pad any pressure points.
- If legs are uninjured and can be bent, apply hobbles to pasterns and bring hooves together with carabiners and webbing.
- 7. Use a rope and pulley to draw hooves towards belly and tie off on dorsal side. Place padding under rope as needed.
- 8. Strap neck to glide with Velcro if sedated.
- Attach haul ropes to front and tag lines to back of glide to help direct.
- 10. Animal handler attends head during transport.
- Animal should be sedated if possible. If not animal may struggle especially when glide stops moving.
- Make sure the path is clear when ready to transport so there will be no unnecessary stops.
- Work from dorsal side of animal avoiding the leg "kick zone" even if animal is sedated.
